## NAMPA & MERIDIAN IRRIGATION DISTRICT TAKING NOMINATIONS FOR BOISE PRECINCT DIRECTOR ELECTION

The Treasure Valley's largest irrigation district is scheduled to hold an election November 3 for the District's Board of Directors, officials with the Nampa & Meridian Irrigation District announced today.

This is an opportunity for individuals living in the Boise Precinct to help manage the affairs of the Irrigation District. A board member serves a vital role in the overall operation of the NMID irrigation water delivery operation. There are three Directors, one in each precinct, who together compose the District's Board of Directors that provide overall management of District affairs.

Individuals who are interested in the position of Director for Precinct No. 1, the Boise (Perkins) Precinct, can file a nominating petition with the District between September 4-24. Potential candidates for the Director position must live in the Boise Precinct and meet any qualifications required by law. Individuals should contact the District for more information at (208) 466-7861.

Precinct 1 is roughly bordered by Eagle Road on the West, Chinden Blvd. on the North, 28<sup>th</sup> Street on the East, and Lake Hazel Road on the South. An area of land generally encompassing the Micron Technology Corporation complex is also included. Under Idaho law, if the deadline for nominations has passed and only one qualified candidate has been nominated, an election will not be held. Instead, the Board of Directors will declare the candidate as elected.

The Nampa & Meridian Irrigation District is a water storage, conveyance and distribution system founded in 1904. The District supplies irrigation water to approximately 69,000 acres of farmland, residential and commercial lands, including providing or supporting pressurized irrigation for lands in Ada and Canyon counties.
