A special open house to honor her retirement will be held December 15 from 3-5 pm at the NMID Office, 1503 First Street South in Nampa. The public is invited to join in wishing her a long and happy retirement, NMID officials said.

Hewlett started in the NMID Collection Department in 1991 and worked her way through the platting department, water record and IT departments eventually assuming the position of Assistant Secretary Treasurer in June 2008.

"I have loved the challenges of my different positions at the Nampa & Meridian Irrigation District and thank the Board of Directors of Nampa & Meridian Irrigation District for the career opportunities they have given me," she said.

There is no retirement rocking chair waiting for Hewlett. She and her husband Brad plan to go into missionary work in Mexico starting in January with a six-week mission to Puerto Penasco (Rocky Point), Mexico.

"When we finish that it will be time for travelling, fishing in Hells Canyon and camping, all the things I haven't had time to do," she said. Her husband graduates from Boise Bible College in May and then the couple will return to missionary work in Mexico.
